Dear Parents/carers.

What Can Parents Do?

It's important to be aware of what your kids do online. But snooping can alienate them and damage the trust you've built together. The key is to stay involved in a way that makes your child understand that you respect their privacy but want to make sure they're safe.

Address inappropriate content.

If your child encounters inappropriate content online, there are a number of steps you can take:

- Refrain from them responding.
- Take a screen capture or print a copy of the concerning online content.
- If you think the content is explicit, pornographic or exploitative of minors, contact the police
- Block the offending use
- Report the content to the social media provider (e.g. Facebook). Providers can remove content that contravenes their Terms of Use.






